


2020 Improvement Group & Workshop

The aim of the End of Life Care Improvement Group is to improve the provision of high quality end of life care by sharing information on implementing innovative and effective practice. This forum provides a collaborative environment to share data and stories about caring for individuals and families at the end of life. The intended outcome to embed the importance of quality End of Life care in the whole of health system.

The End of Life Care Improvement Group meeting is an excellent forum for discussion and a great opportunity to hear from leading experts in the field and share innovations from our membership. What do group subscribers receive?

- The Paediatric End of Life Care report which is limited to in-hospital neonatal and paediatric in hospital deaths.
- We have an exciting addition to the EOLC report suite, Quality of Dying Audit, which includes quality of dying indicators, including evidence of end of life conversation, advance directives, medical guidance plans and anticipatory symptom management.
 This takes the form of a chart audit, using Quality of Dying Audit tool developed by Canterbury which is then linked to your casemix data.

- Set and monitor performance expectations.
